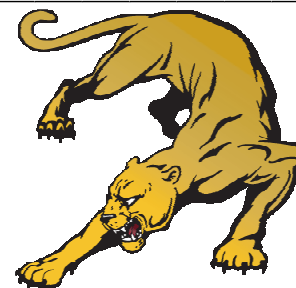

DISTRICTWIDE ACCREDITATION

After a three-day, exhaustive review by officials from AdvancedED – an organization dedicated to advancing excellence in education through accreditation – Lee County Public Schools will be recommended to receive district-wide accreditation. This is a significant accomplishment and places Lee County Public Schools as one of the nation's largest, fully accredited school districts. "This is validation to what we've been doing, from the classroom to the District office," said Dr. James Browder, Superintendent of Schools. "Together, we are so much more powerful than we are as individuals,

and this designation confirms that we are a quality school system working together for children." As part of the process, officials from AdvancedED spent the past three days talking with teachers, administrators, community members, students and stakeholders, as well as, reviewing District documents to determine exactly what the mission and focus of Lee County Public Schools is, and how well they're doing. The review committee agreed – Lee County Public Schools is committed to quality and continuous improvement, and that keeping "The Main Thing" is at the root of everything we do.

For Lee County Public Schools, the "Main Thing" is student achievement. "We recommend, without hesitation or equivocation the School District of Lee County be accredited as a quality school system," said Dr. Nikki Armato, the leader of the 17-person review committee. Districtwide accreditation validates the District has a systems-approach to improving student performance, and it recognizes that increasing student achievement involves more than simply addressing instruction – it shows how well ALL the parts of the District work together to meet the needs of students.

STOCK MARKET RESULTS

Caloosa Middle had two students in the **Top10** (out of 2036 contestants) at the end of the *News-Press Stock Market Game*. **Baothach Ngo** came in **Third** with a total gain of \$7,826, or 15.7%, and **Luc Luccin** came in **Sixth** with a total gain of \$6,718, or 13.4%.
